2. The receiving institution will send its decision within four weeks.
3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than four weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
4. Termination of the agreement

The agreement will become operative on the date of signature of both universities and shall remain in force for a period of three years. If neither organisation gives written notice to the other at least till 1st September 2016 (will only take effect as of 1st September 2017), the agreement shall be automatically extended for another three year period. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.


